

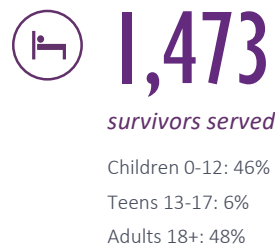
CLIENT & SERVICE STATISTICS

LAST YEAR, **10,592** PEOPLE WERE SERVED THROUGH ONE OR MORE OF WOMEN AGAINST ABUSE'S SERVICES. THIS INCLUDES 5,092 SURVIVORS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

EMERGENCY SAFE HAVENS

Women Against Abuse operates the only shelters in Philadelphia for people experiencing intimate partner violence. Women Against Abuse's two 100-bed safe havens provide 24-hour security, three meals a day, and comprehensive on-site supportive services. The safe havens serve survivors of all gender identities and sexual orientations. Almost all residents live below federal poverty levels.



SOJOURNER HOUSE

The region's first transitional housing program dedicated to intimate partner violence, Sojourner House provides up to 18 months of safe housing, case management, childcare, behavioral health services, and life skills education for families made homeless by domestic violence. The facility consists of 15 apartment units, a computer lab, early learning center, laundry room, offices for program staff and a playground.

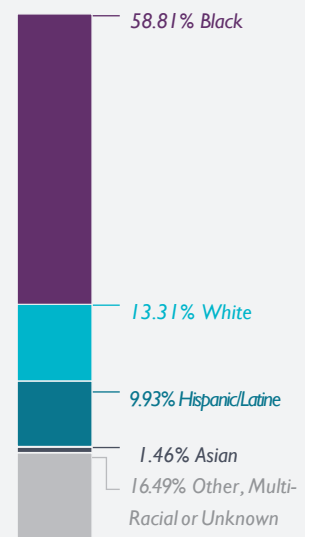


SAFE AT HOME & RAPID REHOUSING

The Safe at Home and Rapid Rehousing programs provide survivors with community-based case management and housing assistance to ensure their long-term independence from abuse.

WOMEN AGAINST ABUSE LEGAL CENTER

The Legal Center provides free services to help people experiencing intimate partner violence obtain lasting legal protections, including protection from abuse and sexual violence orders, and child custody and support. The Legal Center has launched innovative programs to reach underserved populations and those at highest risk of being injured or killed.

POLICY & PREVENTION

Women Against Abuse educators work with professionals, youth, survivors, and the community at large to increase awareness of intimate partner violence, challenge prevalent stigma, and train the community to effectively intervene in the cycle of abuse.

This includes **565** youth who learned about healthy relationships in our multi-session **S.A.F.E.R.**TM program (Safety Awareness For Every Relationship).

Women Against Abuse is the lead operator of the 24-hour, citywide hotline (1-866-723-3014), which provides crisis intervention, safety planning and resources. All calls are free and confidential. Interpretation services are available for all languages.

Women Against Abuse operates the hotline in partnership with Congreso de Latinos Unidos, Lutheran Settlement House and Women in Transition.
